

## Instructions for the Star Wars Gift Cards Collector's Album

1. If your album package included this file as PDF softcopy, print one copy, in color if possible.
2. If your album package did not include hardware, obtain one 3-ring binder, 1½ inch thick, preferably jumbo size with front cover clear pocket.
3. If your album package did not include hardware, obtain the following clear plastic pocket pages:
  - a. Page type 1: 8½ x 11 enlargement page, such as Century Photo PP100-519PK
  - b. Page type 2h: Jumbo 5x7 enlargement page, such as Century Photo PP100-514PK
  - c. Page type 2v: APS 4x11 page, such as Century Photo PP100-518PK
  - d. Page type 9: standard 9-slot "hobby card" page, such as Century Photo PP100-530PK
4. The printed pages correspond exactly to the pages of your album, with the following exceptions:
  - a. The first printed page can be used on the front cover of your album binder (if your binder has a clear page holder pocket on front).
  - b. This instruction page is for informational purposes only and does not need to be put into the album.
5. Construct your album one page at a time, in order, so that you don't get things mixed up.
6. For each printed album page:
  - a. Determine which plastic page type to fill:
    - i. If the printed page has no black outlines, use page type 1.
    - ii. If the printed page has two large horizontal rectangles, use page type 2h.
    - iii. If the printed page has two large vertical rectangles, use page type 2v.
    - iv. If the printed page has 9 small rectangles, use page type 9.
  - b. Carefully cut apart the rectangle sections of the printed page along the black lines. Some page types have no bottom border; you can cut down to the bottom of the page. As you cut each rectangle, insert it into the plastic page in the same orientation as the printed page. (If you cut all the rectangles at once, you might forget where each one goes in the plastic page!)
  - c. Some paper rectangles will remain in the album as titles and headers; paper rectangles with photos of collectibles will be replaced (or covered) with the actual collectibles. (Some Paper rectangles should remain in the album to prevent items on the next page from showing through.)
  - d. Add the plastic page, now with each slot filled with printed paper, to the binder.
7. Now you're ready to add your collection!
  - a. As you add individual gift cards to your album, remove the printed paper slip (since the gift card is slightly taller but narrower than the paper, it won't look good to have the paper backing showing unequally).
  - b. Some gift cards will slide partially out of their slots as you turn the pages. You can put a tiny piece of clear tape over the top of the slot, or you can use a tiny dab of fun-tak on the back of the gift card to hold it in place.
  - c. As you add backers and stand-ins to your album, you can elect to keep some paper backing for aesthetics.
  - d. Some backers and stand-ins will slide around inside the oversized pockets. You can use a tiny dab of fun-tak on the back of the collectible to hold them in place.
